This war club has the name Blue Cloud Grass Dancer written in togia on various locations on the club. Blue Cloud was born in 1837 to Kuhinyan Oglala Lakota Sioux parents and was a member of the Little Wound Band.

4 1860 Colt Army Percussion Revolver S/N 88094 with Chief Long Hat's story



This Revolver has the name Chief Long Hat written a number of times in togia, along with the Oglala and Wakan marks. Long Hat, an Oglala Lakota Sioux, was a chief of the Wakan and belonged to a special sect called the Yuwipi.

7 Sharps Percussion SRC S/N



This Sharps rifle has the name Long Wolf Minneconjou written in togia on the action as part of the message: "Battle-Rosebud-Greasy Grass (Little Bighorn)-together-kill-plenty-soldier-rode together-Charging Bear-High Bear".

P. Webley & Son 10 GA Shotgun

This P. Webley & Son shotgun from Birmingham, England, has the name Blue Horse written in togia on the leather on the stock, along with the brass button configuration of the Wagluhe Sica Bad Face Band and prayer buttons.

This rifle has the name Blue Coat Sans Arc written in togia on it with a message: "Blue Coat Sans Arc-Miwatani Warrier Society-rode together-Oglala-Brule-Cheyenne-Blackfoot-Hunkpapa-Minneconjou-gifted-headman-Sitting Bull".

5 1851 Colt Navy Percussion Revolver S/N 106648



This 1851 Colt Navy Percussion Revolver S/N 106648 has the name Little Shield written in togia on the right and left grips and the bottom of the back strap, as part of the message: "rode with-Soreback-brother-He Dog-Greasy Grass".

This Derringer has the name One Bull Hunkpapa written in togia numerous times on it. One Bull was Sitting Bull's younger half-brother, acting as one his personal guards and riding with him during the Indian Wars.

6 Strongheart Missouri War Axe



This war axe has the name Bull Ghost written in togia multiple times on both sides of the blade. Bull Ghost was born in 1854 to Hunkpapa Lakota Sioux parents and grew up with Sitting Bull. He and was a member of Sitting Bull's Icira Band.

9 1860 Colt Army Percussion Revolver S/N 130044



This 1860 Colt Army Percussion Revolver, the name Knife is written in togia on the left grip as part of the following message: "Knife-Grass Dancer-rode together-Black Bear".

12 Double Horn War Club



This war club shows the name Bear Bird Minneconjou written in togia in various locations. Bear Bird was born in 1853, the son of the Minneconjou Bear In The Wood and his wife iron Claw.

War Bonnet's name is written in togia on this revolver, with a message "War Bonnet-Black Bear-protect-War Bonnet-see plenty death-Wounded Knee". He was an Oglala Lakota Sioux and belonged to Chief Red Dog's has the personal mark of Running Antelope. Band.

This 1860 Colt Army Percussion Revolver S/N 174761 has the name Blue Hawk written twice in togia on the right grip along with the Oglala and Oyuhpe Oglala marks.

This Springfield rifle has the name Many



Bulls Hunkpapa written in togia near the cartouche and the brass button configuration of Gall's Meat Necklace is also found on the stock

This Winchester has the name Little Fox written in togia on the stock, as well as the togia symbol Araphoe.



This Hudson Bay Company Dag Knife has the name Blue Horse written in togia on the handle, along with the marks of Wagluhe Loafer Band and the Society of the Heyota Akicita Warrior Society of the Oglala.

General George Custer's Revolver S/N 12314

National Arms Derringer S/N



This revolver has the name G.A. Custer on the butt as shown in the picture under "More History".



This Derringer pistol has the name Robe written in togia on the right side of the action, right and left grips, along with the Grass Dancer mark. Robe surrendered with Crazy Horse on May 6, 1877, along with his wife and daughters at Red Cloud Agency.





This Spencer SRC has the name Bad Bear written in togia on the right side of the stock, as part of the following message: "Hunkpapa-Bade Bear-rode together-Little Buffalo-fought together-Turning hawk-Battle Greasy Grass".

1859 Sharps SRC S/N 6224




This Sharps SRC has the name Old Wolf Chevenne written three times in togia on the right side of the stock, along with the symbol of the Council of 44 Chiefs. Old Wolf was a Northern Cheyenne and was sometimes called Cut Foot.

1866 Winchester Rifle S/N 24



This Winchester Rifle has the name Yellow Bull Minneconjou written three times in togia on the left side of the action, along with the mark for kill written twice. He followed Chief Hump into Canada and surrendered with him in September 1881.

Black Elk and Black Elk Sr. framed black and white photos

1849 Colt Pocket Richards-46 **Mason Conversion S/N** 10165



Bulls Eye written in togia on the grip with the mark for Blackfeet. The Blackfeet joined Sitting Bull in Canada and Bulls Eye participated in the Milk River Battle of 1879 and surrendered as part of Shot In The Head's Band in 1881.



This 1851 Colt Navy Conversion Revolver S/N 939 has the name Yellow Cloud Sans Arc written in togia along with the war chief on the right grip.

McClellan Military Saddle

Saddle model developed in 1859 by Captain McClellan specifically for the cavalry. The 7th Cavalry would have used this type of saddle during the Indian Wars and beyond.




This Winchester - Hotchkiss Bolt Action 45 -70 Rifle, S/N 4186, has the name Red Bear written in togia on the left side of the wrist, along with the symbol for Metis.

Colt 3rd Model Derringer 48 S/N 14781



This Colt Derringer has the name Red Bull written in togia on the grip along with the mark for Greasy Grass. Red Bull and his mother were sent to the Standing Rock Reservation and moved to the Pine Ridge Reservation.

This rifle has the names Red Bird / Little Wolf Cheyenne written in togia on the action. Red Bird was also known as Young Little Wolf and fought in the Indian Wars, eventually joining General Miles as a scout.

This rifle has the name Mountain Sheep written in togia on the stock. Mountain Sheep lived with his family in the White Clay District of the Pine Ridge Reservation.

This musket has the name Wolf Tooth writtenin togia on the action with the message: "Cheyenne-kill plenty soldiers-Little Sheeps Creek (Little Bighorn)". He became a medicine man and eventually lived in Montana until his death in 1907 at the age of 87. 61 1873 Springfield Trapdoor SRC S/N 40555

This SRC has the name Little Bird written in togia on the wrist and stock. Little Bird surrendered with Crazy Horse in 1877 and settled in the Porcupine District of the Pine Ridge Reservation.

This SRC has the name White Shield is written in togia on the stock along with a special message: "rode with friend-Hunter of Heart Society-kill soldier". There are numerous other marks on the SRC.

This carbine has the name Walking Bull written in togia on the stock. Walking Bull lived in the White Clay District of the Pine Ridge Reservation.

65 1873 Springfield Trapdoor Carbine S/N 124538

66 1873 Springfield Trapdoor Carbine S/N 149312





This SRC has the names Blue Hawk and Sacred Cow written in togia on the wrist, along with the togia mark for son. Blue Hawk and his family did not surrender with Crazy Horse and eventually followed Big Road's Band into Canada.

This rifle has a message on the stock: "Black Bear-gifted rifle-rode with Little Spotted Horse-soldier scout-son of Black Bear". Black Bear gave this rifle to his son, William, born in 1880.

This carbine has the name Center Feather written in togia on the stock, along with "soldier scout". The Collector believes that Center Feather was an enlistee of the Indian Scout Unit in the 9th Cavalry.

68 1873 Springfield Trapdoor SRC S/N 163388

Barnett Trade Musket dated 1835

This carbine has the name Red Bull written in togia many times on the action, along with many other marks. Red Bull settled on the Grand River and enjoyed trapping fur. He traded fur for this carbine at Fort Yates in 1882.

This SRC has the name Lone Bear Oglala written in togia on the stock with the brass button configuration of the Oyuhkpe Band of Crazy Horse. Lone Bear rode with Crazy Horse in many battles and surrendered with him in 1877.

This musket from the Hudson Bay Company has the name King Man Sans Arc written in togia on the action, along with a message and other togia marks.

70 High Walking's 7th Cavalry Bugle

71 1860 Colt Army 4-Screw Percussion Revolver S/N 14531 72 1865 Spencer SRC S/N 857







The Collector believes this is a 7th Cavalry bugle, and found the name High Walking written in togia on the bugle near the mouthpiece. High Walking participated at the Battle of Little Bighorn in the southern part of the battle.

The name Spotted Cloud is written in togia on the left grip of this revolver as part of the following togia message: "Hunkpapa-Spotted Cloud-rode-together-Hunkpapa-Chief Bear Ribs."

This SRC has the name White Bull Minneconjou written in togia on the wrist with a message "White Bull-Minneconjou-Hundred In The Hand", along with two other messages written on the SRC.

73 1873 Sharps Sporting Rifle S/N 8102



This rifle has the name Big Foot Cheyenne written in togia on the stock with the Cheyenne symbol for sharp shooter. The Collector believes Big Foot carried this rifle at Little Bighorn and until his death in 1901.

76 Full size 6 pounder Field Carriage replica of cannons manufactured from 1841 to 1865



Cannons sold at the auction will be manufactured in Virginia after purchase. Delivery time within 90 days from auction. Full payment due on

79 Harry Armstrong "Autie" Reed's 1873 Colt Army Single Action US Marked Revolver S/N 15353



The Collector has found both togia and English on this revolver.

82 Charging Bear 1873 Springfield Trapdoor SRC S/N 40497



Charging Bear's name is written in togia on the stock of this SRC along with the message: "Minneconjou-kill-many-soldiers".

74 1859 Sharps Percussion SRC S/N C23767



This SRC has the name Yellow Bird written in togia on the stock and forearm. Yellow Bird fought at the Rosebud battle with Crazy Horse and when Crazy Horse was killed in 1877, he joined Big Road and travelled to Canada to join Sitting Bull.

1860 Colt 4 Screw Percussion Revolver S/N 23138



While not much is known of Yellow Breast, this revolver has his name written on the grip with a message: "Yellow Breast-rode-together-Spotted Hand-battle-Greasy Grass-protect-village-kill-plenty-soldier".

80 Bear's Eye 1873 Colt Single Action US Marked Revolver S/N 15264



Bear's Eye, also known as Wolf Stands In The Cold, was born in 1854 to Arikara parents and later married the sister of Red Bear, his close friend. Bear's Eye joined the scouting service just before George Custer went on the Black Hills Expedition in 1874.

Looking Cloud's 1873 Colt Single Action 44 Cal Revolver S/N 5765



Looking Cloud fought in at least three major battles: Rosebud, Little Bighorn and Wolf Mountain. His name is found on the grip with battle marks. 75 1860 Colt Army Percussion Revolver S/N 175295

This revolver has the name White Moon Cheyenne written in togia as part of the message: "White Moon-Cheyenne-fight-kill-horse soldier-battle-Little Sheeps Creek (Little Bighorn)" on the grips.



Sitting Bull's name is written in togia on the left side of the brass action as part of the message: "Sitting Bull-Icira-Hunkpapa-Chief-Sitting Bull-Wakan-Sitting Bull-Big Medicine-War Bonnet".

Red Shirt's 1861 Remington Percussion Revolver S/N 10834



Red Shirt is written in togia on the grip of this revolver, along with the mark of Soreback Hunkpapa and a togia message. During the Sioux Wars, Red Shirt rode with He Dog and became his close friend.

84 Flying Hawk's 1859 Sharps SRC S/N 52975



Flying Hawk's name is written in togia on the wrist with a message: "friend - Crazy Horse". Other references to riding with Crazy Horse are also marked on the SRC.



Red Bull is written in togia on the grip and in other locations on the gun. He surrendered early and after Crazy Horse was killed, he followed Red Bull into Canada and eventually settled on the Pine Ridge Reservation.

Knife King's 1860 Colt Richards Model M Test Revolver S/N 1147M



Knife King Hunkpapa is written in togia on several locations on this gun. According to a family story, Knife King was wounded at the Battle of Little Bighorn and he found this revolver in the saddle bag of a soldier's horse

Blue Cloud's 1861 Colt Navy Conversion Revolver S/N 2210



Blue Cloud Hunkpapa is written three times on this revolver. He fought in the Indian Wars and followed Sitting Bull into Canada, surrendering with him in 1881.

94 Killed By Thunder's 1851 Colt Navy Conversion Revolver S/N 3547



Killed By Thunder Hunkpapa's name is written in togia numerous times on this weapon. He rode with Sitting Bull throughout the Indian Wars and was among the last to surrender with Sitting Bull in 1881.

86 Dirt Kettle's 1860 Spencer SRC S/N 21321



Dirt Kettle's name is written in togia on this carbine, with the Oglala Grass Dancer mark. He became a great warrior and was selected by Crazy Horse to become a Grass Dancer, surrendering with Crazy Horse in 1877.

Good Hand Colt Model 1871-72 Open Top S/N 1811



Good Hand is written in togia a number of times on this gun. He fought at the Battle of Little Bighorn and also apprenticed at the Spotted Tail Agency.

92 Brave Bull's Frank Wesson 44 Rimfire Rifle S/N 2212



This rifle was taken by Brave Bull from a Shoshone scout curing the Rosebud Battle. The rifle is marked with Shoshone band marks on the stock and is marked in togia with Brave Bull's name and his son's name.

95 Blue Horse's 1871-1872 Colt Open Top Revolver S/N 3687



Blue Horse's name is written in togia in numerous locations on the gun. He rode with Crazy Horse during the Indian Wars and surrendered in 1877.

87 Big Leg's 1873 Colt Single Action US Marked Revolver S/N 1061

lot: 85 - 96



Big Leg Hunkpapa is written in togia on the back strap with the letters "T C" and "7" which the Collector believes are the initials of Thomas Conner and Company 1, 7th Cavalry. Big Leg is also written elsewhere on the gun.

90 Bear Soldier's 1860 Colt Richards Conversion S/N 2058



Bear Soldier Hunkpapa is written in togia in numerous places on this weapon. He rode with Thunder Hawk's band at the Battles of Rosebud, Little Bighorn, Wolf Mountain and Milk River.

93 Good Bear Boy's 1861 Navy/Navy Conversion Revolver S/N 2736



Good Bear Boy Hunkpapa is written in togia numerous times on this revolver. The story of Good Bear Boy's experience at the Battle of Little Bighorn can be found in "More History".

96 Red Bear's 1873 Colt Single Action Revolver US Marked S/N 4042



Red Bear's name is written in togia on the gun with marks of "gifted" also in place. Red Bear was a Sans Arc and during the battle of Little Bighorn he was selected to guard the sacred tent and peace pipe and was given this revolver for his role in guarding the tent.

97 White Face's 1858 Remington Beal Navy Revolver S/N 5302



White Face Oglala is written in togia in several places on this gun. He fought in the Indian Wars with Crazy Horse and surrendered in 1877, settling at the Red Cloud Agency.

Rattlesnake Nose's 1860 Colt Army Richards-Mason Conversion S/N 6553



Rattlesnake Nose's name is written three times on this gun. He grew to be head man of the Kit Fox Warrior Society and at the Battle of Little Bighorn was tasked with guarding the Cheyenne camp for a short time.

103 Black Bear's 1860 Spencer SRC S/N 12433



Black Bear's name is written in togia on this rifle, along with the mark for Grass Dancer. He was selected by Crazy Horse to be a Grass Dancer, a special unit tasked with guarding the Black Hills.

One Horn's 1873 Colt Single Action Revolver S/N 16173



One Horn's name is written in togia on this revolver. One Horn was also known as Lone Horn and became one of the great chiefs of the Minneconjou, participating in many battles.

98 Crow King's 1873 Winchester First Model Rifle S/N 5548



Crow King's name appears in togia on this rifle numerous times, along with messages telling of his riding with Sitting Bull, who he grew up with. He fought alongside Crazy Horse in the Indian Wars.

101 Fox Tail Cheyenne's 1861 Colt Richards-Mason Conversion Revolver S/N



This revolver has numerous numbers imprinted on it, along with the s/n 7181. The name Fox Tail Cheyenne is written in togia numerous times on this gun as well. Fox Tail was the son of Rock Forehead and fought in many battles.

104 Crow Breast/Gizzard's 1873 Colt Single Action Revolver S/N 13267



The name Crow Breast/Gizzard is found written in togia on various locations on the revolver, along with the Hidatsa mark. Crow Breast was also known as Gizzard and his personal history can be found in "More History".

American Horse's 1860 Spencer SCR S/N 18333



American Horse's name is written in togia in numerous locations on this rifle and he was responsible for the death of Captain Fetterman at the Fetterman Massacre. 99 Buffalo Horse's 1860 Richards-Mason Conversion S/N 6336



Buffalo Horse's name is written in togia many times on this gun. Buffalo Horse was a Brule Lake Sioux who fought in many battles and led 65 lodges of Brule Orphan Lakota Sioux.

102 1873 Colt Single Action US Cavalry Revolver S/N 8048



This revolver was examined by John A. Kopec in 2009 and his research shows that the subject revolver was originally shipped from Colt around January 5, 1874 and its late serial number would seem to preclude it from having served with the 7th Cavalry.

High Bear's 1873 Colt Action US Marked Revolver S/N 13380



High Bear's name appears written in togia in numerous places on this revolver, along with the Arikara symbol. He joined Custer's 7th Cavalry scout unit and was present at the Battle of Little Bighorn.

Black Fox's 1873 Colt Single Action Revolver S/N 19479



Black Fox's name is written in togia numerous times on this revolver. He was an Arikara and enlisted as a member of Custer's Black Hills expedition in 1874.

This rifle has a number of messages written in togia on it, including the title of this item. Crazy Horse's wife told her wedding story to Ellen Black Elk, Benjamin Black Elk's wife, from whom the Collector heard the story.

Chief Walking Bird's name appears in numerous places in togia on the revolver. He was a Lower Yanktonai Sioux and became the sub-chief of a small band of Chief Cottonwood's Band and fought in the Indian Wars

No Flesh's 1860 Colt Percussion Revolver S/N 38823



No Flesh is written in togia on this revolver. He was an Oglala Lakota Sioux and rode with Crazy Horse at Little Bighorn as a sharp shooter. He surrendered early and joined the Indian Police, achieving the rank of corporal.

118 Bear Feather's 1860 Colt Percussion Revolver S/N 76990



Bear Feather's name is written in togia on this revolver, along with Crazy Horse and the mark for friend. Snake Creek's 1855 Sharps Slant Breach S/N 21929



Snake Creek's name is written in togia in a number of places on this rifle, along with a message regarding his killing of a soldier at Little Bighorn. He fought in many battles of the Indian Wars and surrendered with Crazy Horse in 1877.

One Bear's 1863 Starr Arms Single Action Percussion Revolver S/N 28192



One Bear's name in togia is found on this revolver with a message that indicates One Bear fought with White Bull at Little Bighorn. In "More History" you find the history of One Bear, relating to another weapon.

116 Bear Run in Woods' 1873 Colt Single Action 45 Cal Revolver S/N 46056



A lot of togia is written on this revolver, including the name Bear Run in Woods, but there is a lot of wear and it was difficult for the Collector to make out more than one other name, "Friend Afraid of Eagle".

Prairie Fox's 1873
Springfield Trapdoor SRC
S/N 77023



Prairie Fox was Eagle Elk's son-in-law and Benjamin Black Elk told the story that Prairie Fox picked up a carbine from the 7th Cavalry during and after the battle of Wounded Knee. Pawnee Leggins / Kills the Bear Model 1886 Winchester Rifle S/N 25029



The names of Pawnee Leggins and Kills The Bear appear numerous times in togia on this rifle. The Collector believes Pawnee Leggins purchased the rifle and gave the rifle as a gift to his son, Kills The Bear.

Laughing's 1873 Springfield Trapdoor SRC S/N 34146



This rifle has the name Laughing written in togia on it with a message indicating he gifted it to his son, Fork Horn. There are many messages written on the rifle, one of which indicates Laughing fought at Little Bighorn.

Horse Bear's 1851 Colt Navy Conversion S/N 61779



The name Horse Bear is written in togia in a number of places on this gun. Horse Bear rode in the battles of Rosebud and Little Bighorn and surrendered with Crazy Horse in 1877, eventually settling on the Pine Ridge Reservation.

120 Standing Bull's 1863 New Model Sharps SRC S/N 79951



The name Standing Bull is written in togia on this rifle and he rode with his brother One Iron Horn at the Battle of Little Bighorn.

Old Crow's 1851 Colt Navy 121 **Percussion Revolver S/N** 81003



Old Crow Blackfeet is written in togia on this revolver in a few places. He was born to Blackfeet parents but little history has been written about him.

Feather's 1860 Colt Army 124 **Percussion Revolver S/N** 114986



This revolver has the name Feather written on it in togia. He took the Christian name Frank and fought in the Battle of Little Bighorn, later surrendering with Crazy Horse and his Oglala Band.

Bad Heart Bull's 1851 Colt 130 Navy Percussion Revolver S/N 164442



Bad Heart Bull is written in togia on this gun, along with the message "Bad Heart Bull-killhorse soldier-Soreback-brother-He Dog". He Dog is Bad Heart Bull's brother and was good friends with Crazy Horse.

Black Shield's 1849 Colt 122 Pocket Percussion Revolver S/N 102949



Black Shield is written in togia in a few places on this revolver. He was born to Minneconjou Lakota Sioux parents and became a leader of the Minneconiou later in life, fighting in the Battles of Hundred In Hand, Rosebud and Little Bighorn.

Walking Bear's Colt Wells 128 Fargo Percussion Revolver S/N 164042



Walking Bear is written in togia all over this revolver, with the Sans Arc mark. Walking Bear fought alongside Spotted Eagle at many of the Indian Wars and followed him into Canada, surrendering with 357 Sans Arc members.

Face's 1849 Colt Pocket Percussion Revolver S/N 131 253560



Face is written many times on this revolver in togia. He belonged to the Red Dog Band of Makahu Oglala Sioux. Face fought in the Indian Wars but there are no records of where he surrendered.

Walking Bull's 1858 123 Remington 44 Cal Percussion Revolver S/N 113520



The names of Pawnee Leggins and Kills The Bear appear numerous times in togia on this rifle. The Collector believes Pawnee Leggins purchased the rifle and gave the rifle as a gift to his son, Kills The Bear.

Buffalo Tail's 1851 Colt Navy Conversion S/N 147036






